3. All articles must be ticketed, with samples of material(s) attached to the ticket. Suggestions - with safety pins.
4. No entry fee for any classes, which specify that they are for persons under 19 years of age. These do need a ticket with exhibitor number & age indicated on it.

77. **ONTARIO ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES ANNUAL CHAMPIONSHIP QUILT COMPETITION**
- i) Entries must be solely made and quilted by a group or individual and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies' (O.A.A.S.) Fair to be eligible for this competition.
 - ii) Entry quilts must be a minimum of 72" x 90" (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next levels of competition).
 - iii) Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual convention of the O.A.A.S. February 2011.
 - iv) Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
 - v) The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention O.A.A.S. Competitions.
 - vi) Winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by O.A.A.S.
 - vii) The Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies shall not be held liable for any loss occasioned by fire, theft, accident, condition of quilt, the negligence of other exhibitors, officials or otherwise.
 - viii) Any protests must be made to the Homecraft Division of the O.A.A.S. in writing within 5 working days after the last day of the Convention.
 - ix) The entry judged BEST OF SHOW at the February Convention will be declared the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Championship Quilt.

A \$500.00 GRAND PRIZE will be awarded and the Exhibitor will retain ownership of the quilt. A certificate and ribbon will also be awarded to the winner. A \$100 RESERVE GRAND PRIZE will be awarded and the Exhibitor will retain ownership of the quilt.
