## **RULES:**

1. OPEN TO BOYS AND GIRLS ATTENDING SCHOOL IN WALKERTON, CHEPSTOW AND FORMOSA and school children who would normally go to these schools as well as other children who reside in Brockton.
2. Students are to use the entry number of their school rather than an individual number for all exhibits. **NO ENTRY FEE IS REQUIRED.**

3. **ALL WORK MUST BE THAT OF THE STUDENT** - It may be done at school or at home. Preschool exhibitors please include mailing address on entry tags so prizes can be mailed. Only one entry per class.
4. **SCHOOL GRADES** are as of September 2010.
5. Please use 22.5 X 30 CM. (8 1/2 X 11 IN.) sized paper unless otherwise specified due to limited display area. Larger sized paper is needed for some entries and is acceptable. Tags are to be placed on bottom right corner. All work must be neat, clean and attractively displayed. Food displays are to be placed on appropriate-sized disposable plates, placed in plastic bags and closed.
6. Craft materials added to exhibits must be securely attached for display purposes.
7. **PRINTING AND WRITING** - Spelling mistakes, eraser marks and use of correction fluid will be considered as negative factors. Use appropriate-sized **lined** paper. No Artwork. Grades 6 and up use ink. **PICK- UP DATE FOR JUDGING PRINTING AND PENMANSHIP – Friday October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010.**
8. **PLEASE NOTE NEW PAPER SIZE!!! ( 11” x 17”/28cm x 43cm) Walkerton Little Royal Fair Posters** are to be done by students from grades 5-8 using the fair theme. Please use off white tag or cartridge paper. **NO BRISTOL BOARD**, sizes at least **28 cm x 43 or 11” x 17”**. **PICK-UP DATE FOR JUDGING POSTERS – Friday October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010.** The first overall prize winning poster Grades 5 - 8 will be taken to the District 10 Fall Meeting for a chance to win prizes of 1<sup>st</sup> \$25.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$15.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$10.00.
9. All other exhibits are to be taken to the Community Centre Hall on Wednesday,

October 13<sup>th</sup> between 4:00 pm and 6:00 pm OR on Thursday, October 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010, before 9:30am. Judging will commence on Thurs., October 14<sup>th</sup>, at 1:00 pm.

10. Pick-up of all exhibits will be at 4:00 pm on Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2010.
11. Prize money will be distributed through the schools except for preschoolers and home schooled children.
12. Prize money for all elementary classes: 1<sup>st</sup> \$3.00, 2<sup>nd</sup> \$2.00, 3<sup>rd</sup> \$1.00, 4<sup>th</sup> .50.

1. PRINTING - on ½ sheet of paper

2. Make a 2D or 3D decorated fall wreath (max. 30 cm. diameter).
3. Handmade bedroom door knob hanger.
4. Draw and colour your favourite farm vehicle.
5. BAKING: Submit 3. See rule # 6.

### SMARTIE COOKIES

2 ½ C All-purpose flour

½ C white sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp salt

½ C Smarties, crushed (use more if you wish).

1 C brown sugar

1 C shortening

1 ½ tsp vanilla

1 tsp baking soda

Combine all the ingredients making sure you add the Smarties last. Drop by tablespoon on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 300F until brown.

6. FRENCH: Draw and colour “Le machines de la ferme” (machines on the farm ) and label four items in French.

## GRADE 4

### 1. WRITING:

#### MY GARDEN

This is my garden,  
I'll plant it with care,  
Here are the seeds,  
I'll plant in there.  
The sun will shine,  
The rain will fall,  
The seeds will sprout,  
And grow up tall.

2. Create a handmade invitation to your birthday party, use a fictitious name.
3. Make an animal puppet out of a paper lunch bag.
4. Draw and label a picture of an item that was exhibited at a fair you attended.
5. Make a useful item out of a recycled pop or water bottle.
6. **BAKING** Submit 3. See rule # 6

#### GINGER SUGAR COOKIES

2 cups flour	¼ tsp salt
2 tsp baking soda	1 ⅓ cups sugar (divided)
1 tsp cinnamon	¾ cup shortening
1 tsp cloves	¼ cup molasses
1 tsp ginger	1 egg

Sift flour, soda, cinnamon, cloves, ginger and salt. Cream 1 cup sugar and shortening till light and fluffy. Blend in molasses and egg. Add flour mixture, mixing well. Shape in to 3 cm (1¼") balls and roll in sugar. Place 6 cm (2½") apart on greased cookie sheet and bake at 375 for 8-10 minutes.

7. **FRENCH:** Draw and colour "Un jardin potager" (A vegetable garden) and label 5 items, in French.

## GRADE 3 AND 4 SPECIALS

1. **SOLWAY WOMEN'S INSTITUTE**  
Decorate a "real" potato – similar to Mr. Potato Head.
2. **DESJARDINS CREDIT UNION**  
Light switch cover made out of construction paper. Single light switch size "3 x 5"
3. **GAY LEA FOODS**  
Collage of your favourite dairy foods on 8½" x 11" paper.
4. **K OF C LADIES AUXILIARY**  
Wrap a small box (i.e. jello box) using your own homemade birthday designs on paper.
5. **WEATHERALL TRUCKING.**  
Make a Halloween window decoration.
6. **WALKERTON MEAT MARKET**  
Create and decorate a photo frame made from popsicle sticks.

## GRADE 5

1. **WRITING:** A verse of 1 poem from present curriculum or a poem of your own choice.
2. Draw and decorate a picture of the Ferris wheel at the Walkerton Little Royal Fair.
3. Design a "3x5" hand-drawn, coloured, sports trading card showing your favourite sport, picture on front – stats on back.
4. A maple leaf rubbing (collage) using fall colours on 8½" x 11" paper.
5. **BAKING:**  
**DAD'S COOKIES** (submit 3)  
1 cup margarine                      1 egg beaten  
1 cup white sugar                      1 cup flour  
½ cup brown sugar                      1½ cup oatmeal  
3 cups corn flakes  
In a large mixing bowl, cream margarine and sugars, until light and fluffy. Add egg and continue to beat until well mixed. Beat in flour and oatmeal. Lightly crush the corn flakes and stir in. Place on ungreased cookie sheets and bake at 325F for 2 minutes, then flatten with a fork. Continue to bake for 8 minutes.
6. **POSTER - please note new paper size (11" x 17" or 28cm-43cm)** Advertising "Walkerton Little Royal Fair". Follow directions in general listing.
7. **FRENCH:** Draw and colour "Ma Saison Favourite" (My favourite season) and label seven items in French.

## GRADE 6

1. **WRITING:** Using ink, any poem of your choice with 3 stanzas, minimum 8 lines.
2. Hand draw and colour your favourite cartoon character. (not traced)
3. A bookmark, 2" x 6" made completely by hand (no stencil or computer printing).
4. Pencil sketch, free-hand drawing of your choice.
5. **BAKING:** 3 Banana muffins using your own recipe (no nuts or chocolate).
6. **POSTER -please note new paper size (11" x 17" or 28cm-43cm)** Advertising "Walkerton Little Royal Fair". Follow rules from general listing.
7. **FRENCH:** Draw and label a farm with 9 items in French.

## GRADE 5 AND 6 SPECIALS

1. **C.I.B.C.**  
Make a Christmas door decoration.
2. **GAY LEA FOODS**  
Four photographs with humorous captions, mounted.
3. **T-D CANADA TRUST BANK**  
Collection of stamps (minimum 12), titled with a brief explanation, mounted on paper and covered with plastic or film.
4. **CHEPSTOW & DISTRICT LIONS CLUB**  
Sun Catcher using tissue paper or crayon shavings pressed between two layers of wax paper - any theme.
5. **LARSEN AND SHAW LTD.**  
Make a drawing or collage showing drug or smoking awareness.
6. **EDEN GROVE & CARGILL WOMEN'S INSTITUTE**  
Make a collage of flowers or feathers or friends or all three together.
7. **CARGILL - ST. JOSEPH'S CATHOLIC WOMEN'S LEAGUE**  
Create and print a Thanksgiving prayer of six lines.

## GRADE 7

1. **WRITING:** Using ink, any poem of your choice with three stanzas, minimum 12 lines.
2. Make a collage of sports featured in your local newspaper.
3. Draw a tattoo on any theme.
4. Create a wallpaper border sample for your bedroom, no longer than 50 cm.
5. Create a "Humorous wanted" poster. Please use fictitious name.
6. **BAKING:** 1 cooked wedge of homemade pizza. Crust can be bought or homemade. Judged on nutritional ingredients and appearance. See rule # 6
7. **POSTER - please note new paper size (11" x 17" or 28cm-43cm)** Advertising "Walkerton Little Royal Fair". Follow rules from general list.
8. **FRENCH:** Draw "Ma Maison de Reves" (My dream home), and label rooms in French.

## GRADE 8

1. **WRITING:** Using ink, any poem of your choice with three stanzas, minimum 12 lines.
2. Draw to scale (side view) your running shoe.
3. Create a small portable first aid kit.
4. Create a birthday party menu featuring each food group from the new Canada's Food Guide
5. Picture Collage of your favourite websites, no larger than a ½ sheet of bristol board.
6. **POSTER - (please note new paper size – (11" x 17" or 28cm – 43cm)** Advertising "Walkerton Little Royal Fair" Follow rules in general listing.
7. **FRENCH:** Draw "Le guide d'alimentation du Canada", (Canada's Food Guide) and label all items in French.

## GRADE 7 AND 8 SPECIALS

### 1. WALKERTON-HANOVER VETERINARY CLINIC

#### **FIVE MINUTE FUDGE** (submit 3 pieces)

1 1/2 cups chocolate chips

2/3 cup of undiluted carnation evaporated milk

2 Tbsp of butter

1 2/3 cup of white sugar

½ tsp salt

2 cups of miniature marshmallows

1 tsp vanilla

Mix butter, carnation milk, sugar and salt in a saucepan over medium heat. Bring to a boil and cook for 5 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Stir in chocolate chips, marshmallows and vanilla. Stir one to two minutes until marshmallows melt. Pour into buttered 8" square pan and cool for 3 hours before cutting into squares and devouring. Submit 3, see rule #6
